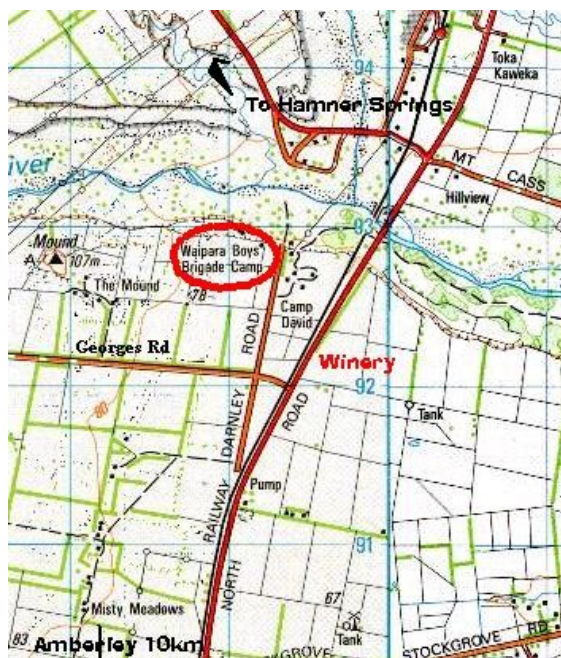


Brigades 11 / 12 Family Holiday Camp

WHO CAN ATTEND

This is a Christian based camp for adult individuals and families, especially for families of Brigade Boys and Girls and families who enjoy camping in a relaxed atmosphere with other Christian families.

A camp "family" may consist of any parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles or other relatives, in a ratio of at least one parent or caregiver over 20 years old to every 3 children.

Come for a few days, or all eight days. Meet new friends and maybe meet friends you haven't chatted with for ages. Enjoy the lovely atmosphere at Waipara, amongst like minded families at a holiday location, which is exclusive to our group.

There will be minimal organisation, but will include optional programmed activities for children, teens and adults. To promote a degree of fellowship and belonging, all campers will meet together for the evening meal.

CAMPSITE ATTRACTIONS

The Boys' Brigade Waipara Riverside Park is an approx, 6 hectares campsite on the south bank of the Waipara river, where summer daytime temperatures are mostly in the 20 to 35 C range and thus too hot and dry for sand flies.

The camp has formed a 1 hectare aquatic recreational area in the river bank just outside the campsite boundary fence, specifically for water activities including swimming and boating activities.

Inside the boundary fence, the campsite has a - BMX track, Adventure playground – Sports field, Swings - 9 metre Abseiling wall - Frisbee Golf course - Go-kart track – 3 Trampolines – Mini golf course – Petanque court – Volley ball net - Water slide and Archery range.

Under shelter, there is opportunity for various crafts, computer games, video work (watching and making), etc.

KARAKIA

Each morning a karakia session will be held. During these sessions our relationship with God will be explored through story, teaching, music and activities. There will be two groups, under 10 year olds, and all others. You are strongly encouraged to attend one of these groups.

On the Sunday morning a camp service will be held during the Karakia time. If campers prefer to attend a local church service they are welcome.

PROGRAMME

The optional activities programme is run by volunteers. These volunteers are campers like you, in fact it could be you, as you might be asked to run or help out with one of the many activities on offer. Please let Sam Beaumont know, before camp if possible, if you have an activity that you are willing to run or help with.

The aim is to provide a varied programme including an orientation activity to get familiar with the campsite, choice days; team challenges a mission, and a daytrip/picnic. There will also be a concert so please come to camp prepared with a skit or talent to share.

The activities are for all ages groups (young and old) except for abseiling and archery where there is a minimum age limit for safety reasons. On the first day of camp you will be asked to indicate your 6 most favourite activities for the choice days (2). This information will be collated and those activities that campers showed the greatest interest in will be offered on the choice days.

In the afternoon before each choice day you will be asked to register for the activities you want to do the next day. Please note; register for a different activity in each of the two timeslots (i.e. no repetition), this ensures that everyone will get a turn.

Choice activities are on average 1-1 ½ hours long. The numbers to each activity will be capped due to supervision and safety issues. Parents, if you would like to do an activity with your child/ren, you will need to register your name for the activity as well.

Possible activities - Abseiling, Archery, Board games, Banana boat, Boating/Sailing, Canoes, Hydraulic rockets, Beading, Bridge building, Card making, Computers, Clay modelling, Go-karts / ATV chariot rides, Gravity Karts, Mountain biking, Oamaru stone, Pre school activities, Rock art / Stone piling, Rafting, Tour of district and 1/2 day walk.

CRECHE

A crèche for the little people may be held in the afternoon from 3.30pm to 5.00pm .

CAMP NEWSLETTER

An in camp newsletter, Guyrope Gossip, issued daily will be available for all campers. This will give daily information, menus, daily rosters, a prayer or thought for the day, and other various activities throughout the camp.

CANTEEN

A canteen will operate during the camp. The terms of trading are by setting up a credit balance, on arrival at camp.

Purchases will be deducted from your account. Any credit balance left on your card at the time of leaving camp, will be refunded.

REMINDER

Feel free to bring your bike, so you can ride it around camp, and remember your helmet.

CATERING

The first catered meal will be lunch on the 27th December and the last will be lunch on the 3rd January.

Evening meals will be cooked for all campers in the main kitchen and eaten in the main dining room and hall.

All bedroom occupants will need to have fully catered meals as there are no food preparation facilities available in the Training Centre. Catered breakfasts and lunches will also be provided for those tent and caravan dwellers, that request them on their registration form. Alternatively breakfasts and lunches may be self catered, using the facilities at Tui kitchen dining room or your own caravan or tent equipment.

ROSTERS

To ease the day to day running of Camp life, adults and teens will be rostered to various duties. Please make yourself available to attend to them. If you are unable to on that given time or day, you are free to change with another person. There will be a committee member available, to call on for help if you are unsure about your duty of the day. The health and safety of all campers are very important.

Please do not forget to bring your own plates, cups cutlery an adequate number of tea-towels, and something to put them in. i.e. plastic container or cloth bag

CASUAL MEALS

The camp has catered only for those meals, as shown on the registration form. However, through daily absences and late cancellations, lunches and dinners may be available for family or friends who visit for the day. Please ask the hosts, or their nominated person, if someone may stay for a meal.

ACCOMMODATION

Caravan and tent sites

There are plenty of sheltered camping areas around the site. 50 sites, 37 of them have access to power.

Campers occupying tents and / or caravans will have the use of Tui Lodge and the Redwood Shelter for breakfast and lunch preparation, if so required.

12 x 12 ridge pole tents may be hired from the camp @ 5 dollars per day. Hirers will be responsible for pitching and putting them away dry, after use.

Campers wishing to bring a dog to camp, will be required to camp in a designated area, and have the dog on a lead at all times.

Family Bedrooms

There are 12 family bedrooms available, on a first registered first allocated basis.

Training centre

1 room sleeps 4 - 1 double bed - 1 x bunk bed.

1 room sleeps 5 – 1 double bed with single bed above - 1 x bunk bed sleeps 2.

10 rooms each sleeping 4 – 2 x bunk beds.

Shared Bunk Rooms

Main Building

4 bunkrooms for those people who just want a bunk and who are prepared to share a room with others.

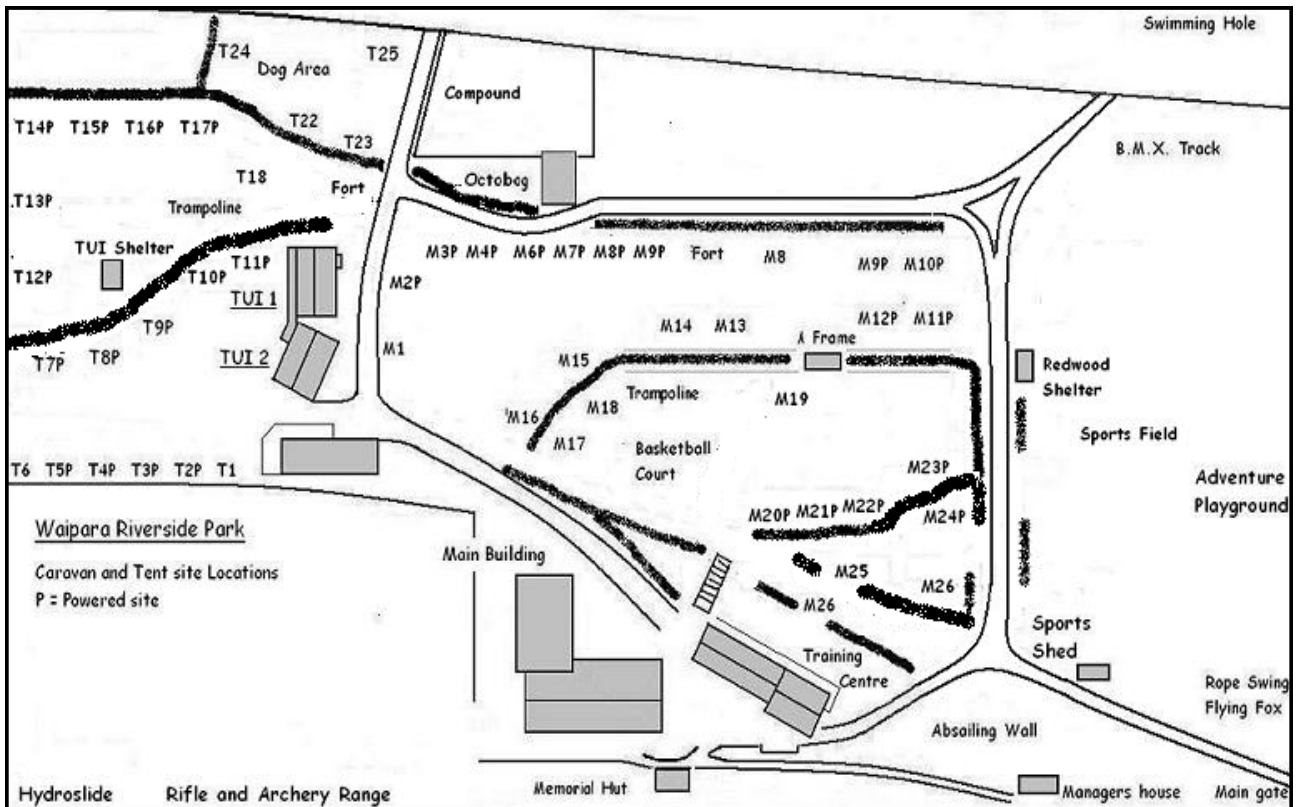
2 rooms each sleep 11 - 4x bunk beds - 3 high

2 rooms each sleep 6 - 2x bunk beds - 3 high

FACILITIES

- The Main Block ablutions are available to ALL campers.
- The Training Centre ablutions are for the use of those occupying the bedrooms.
- The paraplegic shower and toilet can be found in the Training Centre for those campers that need to use it.
- The MAIN KITCHEN is out of bounds to ALL CAMPERS, not currently on kitchen duties.
- The preparation of all food is NOT allowed in the Training Centre.
- The kitchen at Tui 2, is available for the preparation of food, but must be vacated from 9:00 to 10:30 am, and 3:00 to 5:00pm daily.

PLEASE READ THESE RULES PRIOR TO FILLING OUT THE REGISTRATION FORM.

Waipara Riverside Park Rules for all Occupants of the campsite.

1. There is a general prohibition on keeping or using on site: alcoholic beverages, hallucinogenic drugs and firearms. (*The camp management may issue a permit to vary any of these prohibitions subject to strict adherence to some very specific written conditions available on request*)
2. Smoking is not permitted in or around any of the buildings.
3. No open fires are permitted on site. (Only gas or liquid fuelled barbecues may be used.)
4. Campers may not dig tent drains or cut trees or shrubs.
5. Campers and their visitors must understand and comply with their camp organisation's risk management plan.

SPECIFIC FAMILY HOLIDAY CAMP RULES.

1. Parents/caregivers are asked to look after their children's timekeeping, sleeping and washing activities.
2. Our camp risk management plan puts the onus on parents/caregivers to ensure the children and teenagers are supervised by an adult on all activity equipment at all times. This includes activities in the river swimming hole and with vehicles in the riverbed. Activities equipment marked with a red disc (abseiling, etc.) must be supervised by a person currently certified for conducting that activity.
3. Family campers mealtime, attendance, ablutions, health and medical wellbeing will be the responsible of parents/caregivers.
4. Because of the number of young children in camp and the need for them (and adults) to get good sleeps in the cool of the night, campers are requested to be quiet and inactive outdoors between 10pm and 7am.
5. The main camp kitchen is out of bounds to all except staff who are on duty.
